



Instructions on the activities and election of Wings

General information

1. The purpose of the Student Union Wings, i.e. voluntary groups, is to implement TYY's values in their activities and to serve as a contact between the members, Student Union Council, Executive Board and staff. Wings are low-threshold actor groups, through which it is easy to participate in the activities of the Student Union. The Wings allow you to express yourself, create new issues, promote and monitor student interests at the university and in the society, pick out topics for public debate and become a critical citizen.
2. There are four Wings: International Wing, Development Cooperation Wing, Equality Wing and Environmental Wing. The Wings plan and implement their activities together with the Executive Board Member/s responsible for the field and if necessary with the staff. All interested are allowed to participate in the activities of the Wing, i.e. also other than regular members.
3. The Executive Board is responsible for ensuring that the activities of the Wings are in accordance with the rules and values of the Student Union. The Executive Board invites the Chairs of the Wings once per term for a morning school to inform about the activities of the Wings.
4. Together with the responsible Executive Board Member, the Wings draft in the beginning of each calendar year a budget that creates the economic framework for the activities. The Secretary General will approve individual invoices and payment orders of the Wings.
5. Together with the Executive Board Member/s, the Wings compile a Plan of Action in the beginning of each calendar year, relying on TYY's Plan of Action. The Wings record short notes on their meetings, which are stored in an agreed location in order to guarantee continuity of the activities. In the end of the calendar year, the Wings draft a short Annual report declaring the organised events and the operational culture of the Wing.

Call and election of Wings

1. The Executive Board opens a search for Wings twice a year, always in the end of the terms. The regular members are recruited among members of the Student Union with an open search, where the applicants inform their interest in one of the Wings and eventual Chair position.
2. The Executive Board elect members in each Wing, which are not more than five per Wing. A person may be elected in a Wing for either six or twelve months, excluding the Chair, who is always elected for a calendar year.
3. The Executive Board elects the Wing Chair for a calendar year in the beginning of the year. The Wings organise themselves in their first meeting in the beginning of the calendar year, electing a Vice-Chair and distributing other areas of



responsibility. If necessary, the Wings re-organise themselves in the first meeting of the autumn term.

Resignation and discharge from Wing activities

1. Upon a request from a member, the Executive Board May discharge a person from the membership.
2. On the proposal of the Wing, the Executive Board may dismiss a member who continuously neglects their tasks. A member of a Wing can be considered resigned, if they are absent from three consecutive Wing meetings. Before the Executive Board makes a decision on dismissing a member, they must be reserved a chance to be heard.
